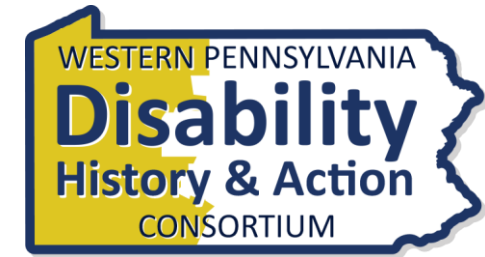

CURTIS PRIDE

**Former Major League Baseball Player,
Disability Advocate**

Born profoundly deaf, Curtis Pride became the first and only full-season Deaf player in the modern era of Major League Baseball, building an 11-season career with teams including the Montreal Expos, Detroit Tigers, Boston Red Sox, New York Yankees, and Los Angeles Angels. Following his playing career, Pride served as head baseball coach at Gallaudet University and later as a Major League Baseball Ambassador for Inclusion. Today, he shares his story and perspective with audiences across the country.

RORY A. COOPER, PhD, PLY

**Professor, Director of HERL, National
Medal Laureate, Paralympic Medalist**

Rory A. Cooper, PhD, PLY, is an internationally recognized leader in rehabilitation engineering, human-centered design, and disability innovation. A Distinguished Professor and Director of the Human Engineering Research Laboratories (HERL) at the University of Pittsburgh, his work has helped advance technologies that support independence, mobility, and participation for people with disabilities and older adults. Dr. Cooper is a Paralympic medalist and National Medal Laureate.
